## **Confirmation Mentor Information**

Studies show that formation of faith is powerfully strengthened in students through meaningful relationships with multiple adults.

Our Confirmation structure has gone through a bit of transition in the past five years, but one strength we've seen is through the opportunity for students to experience Confirmation with a mentor. Due to COVID and other reasons, much of our Confirmation instruction is moving online. Having a mentor work through the lesson or review the lesson with Confirmation students is an excellent way to engage in our vision to be a church family of disciples who make disciples from generation to generation.

We want each student to have an adult mentor work through the Confirmation curriculum with their student. The purpose of a confirmation mentor is to help disciple a Confirmation student.

## Who should we choose?

A person who has a relationship with Jesus and is willing to build into the faith of a confirmation student. The mentor must be the same sex as the student (unless a parent or grandparent). Bethesda can help find a mentor if you do not have someone among your family or friends who can serve in this role.

- A professing believer in Jesus Christ
- 17 years old or older
- Regular attendee of Bethesda (unless approved by Executive Pastor)
- the mentor can be one of the parents- we will leave that decision to each family to make.

## What is expected of a mentor?

To disciple a Confirmation student through the Confirmation program. We ask mentors to commit to a full ministry year (September – August). Mentors may continue year after year, but the consistency of having the same person for at least a year will help greatly.

- Meet weekly or biweekly with student to complete or review Confirmation lessons.
- Willing to learn and familiarize yourself with Luther's Small Catechism
- Willing to engage and encourage student in how to study Scripture
- Engage student in specific activities during the Confirmation lessons
- Pray for your student on a regular basis
- Hold your student accountable for memory work and assignments
- Attend the Confirmation Service with your student and possibly pray for your student
